Dear Parents and Carers.

I hope you are all staying well and looking forward to our staggered return to face to face teaching this term. I certainly am! I have a number of updates and things to bring to your attention this newsletter. Please take the time to read this carefully with the information sent via compass on Monday morning and hopefully all your questions will be answered.

WHOLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM DAY

Please note – Monday 25th May is a whole school curriculum day. **No supervision will be provided at school for students on this day.** It has been mandated by the government that this day be taken for teachers to be on site and preparing for a return for face to face teaching.

Prep to Year 2 arrangements

As we know, prep to year 2 students will be returning to full time face to face teaching on Tuesday 26th May. NO PARENTS ARE PERMITTED ON SITE UNLESS IT IS AN EMERGENCY. Staff will be on the gates from 8:45-9:05 to assist your child with the transition back to on site learning. You will be able to pick your children up from the same gates from 3:30-3:45 each afternoon. Again, the gates will be staffed.

We have designated drop off and pick up points as follows:

Prep: Gate near staff car park at the front of the school

Year 1 and 2: Gate on Memorial Dve

Siblings can enter together through the Memorial Drive gate.

Essential workers with children in Years 3-6

Children of essential workers who are in years 3-6 can still attend school. Any parent needing their child to attend are still required to fill in the DET form that has been distributed many times this term. Students can enter through any access point into the grounds and are to head to the Melaleuca unit. Year 3/4 students will be located in MU3 and MU4 and Year 5/6 students will be in MU5 and MU6. The only entry to be used is the door between 'the palace' (MU1 and MU2) and the main building. The exit door is next to MU4 and MU7.

THERE WILL BE NO ACCESS TO CLASSROOMS VIA THE OFFICE.

While I understand that many of you would like all children to return at the same time, this was not a 'school decision'. We are under instruction from the State Government, Premier of Victoria and Victoria's Chief Health Officer. They have staggered the start to monitor the impact of increased community movement in relation to the spread of COVID-19. Please respect their decisions and keep your children in years 3-6 at home until their return date should a suitable carer be available.

Late Arrivals and Early Leavers

Should your child be late to school please phone the office from your vehicle and an office staff member will take care of getting them to class. Given the office staff have many roles to fulfil, we ask that you make an effort to arrive on time. Early leavers will follow the same process – phone the office from your car and the office staff will take care of getting them from class to you. Again, please limit these to absolutely necessary circumstances so our staff are not put under undue pressure.

Soooo I think we've worked out how the kids can come back!!

Water Bottles and Hand Washing

The drink taps will not be able to be used at this time. It is imperative that all children bring their own drink bottle to school to fill with water. It is preferable that it is named.

There will be hand sanitiser available in all classrooms and at entry and exit points in the school. Should you prefer your child/ren use soap – we ask that you provide them their own soap and, if you'd like, a hand towel, for their personal use.

We will miss having you Boo when school returns to normal.







FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Check with the school office if you are unsure

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- $^{\circ}$ new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- ° changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.
